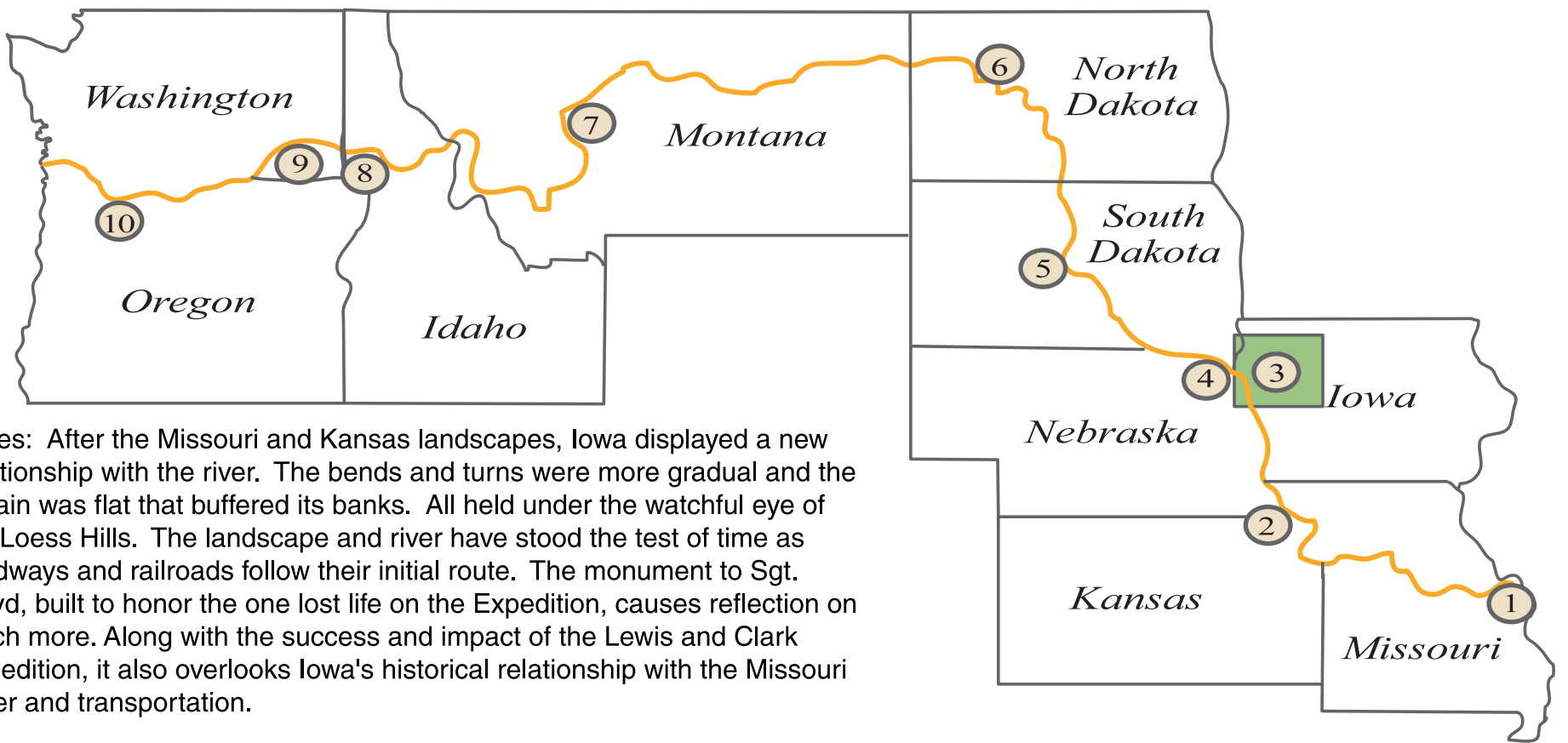
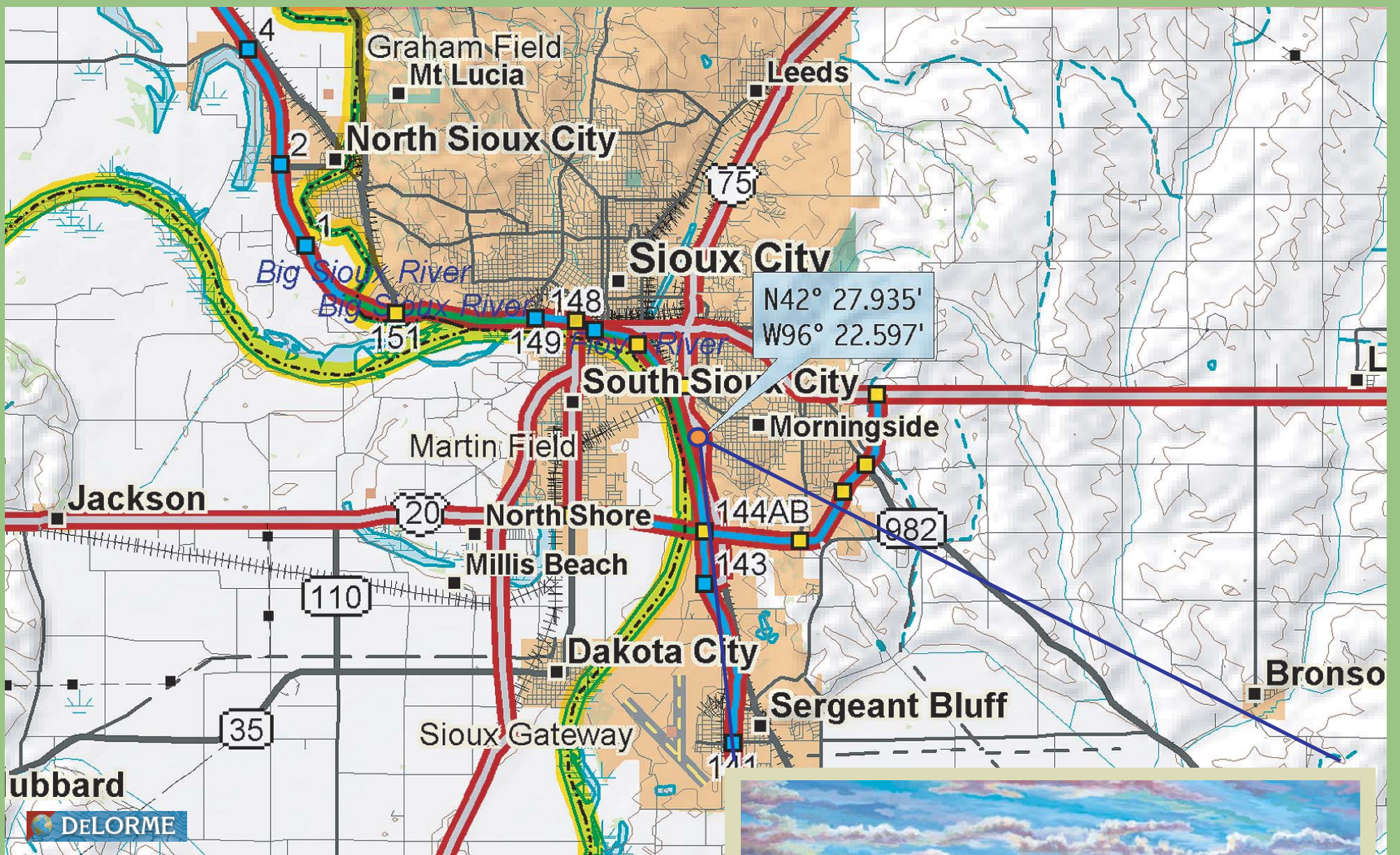


# Discover America: Iowa



Notes: After the Missouri and Kansas landscapes, Iowa displayed a new relationship with the river. The bends and turns were more gradual and the terrain was flat that buffered its banks. All held under the watchful eye of the Loess Hills. The landscape and river have stood the test of time as roadways and railroads follow their initial route. The monument to Sgt. Floyd, built to honor the one lost life on the Expedition, causes reflection on much more. Along with the success and impact of the Lewis and Clark Expedition, it also overlooks Iowa's historical relationship with the Missouri River and transportation.
